Have you given up on making those New Year's resolutions? According to Social psychologist David Myers, author of *The Pursuit of Happiness* and *Intuition*, "All of life is a process of becoming. From womb to tomb, we're developing. So we can, at any time, reshape our future."

The Gospels tell us of Jesus being "conceived in the womb" of Mary by the Holy Spirit and they describe Jesus being sealed in a tomb after his death. Other than a short passage about Jesus when he was 12 years old, what can we know about what shaped Jesus early life? We can see from his birth to 12 years of age he lived with both of his parents who were faithful in observing God's law and all religious customs. As a 12-year-old, Jesus is found in the Temple where he had been for several days listening and asking questions which amazed the teachers. When his parents found him there, he said, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" (Luke 2:49) So we can tell from what little information is given that Jesus' early life was shaped by his devout parents and his knowledge that God was his Father.

Luke goes on to tell us that "Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature and in favor with God and man." Like any child Jesus had to grow and to learn. One of the words we come across several times with regard to Jesus' parents is "ethos", a Greek word meaning custom or habit. Later when Jesus is an adult, we read how it was his ethos to be in the synagogue on the Sabbath and it was his ethos to be in prayer. These customs or habits were formed from Jesus' childhood by his parents.

Charles Duhigg in his book, *The Power of Habit*, describes how habits have the power to shape or reshape our lives. Advances in neurology have enabled scientists to observe changes in the brain as a person's habits are changed. St Paul speaks of an actual possibility when he says, "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind." (Romans 12:2)

It is possible for us to live transformed lives, to have our lives reshaped by the Potter (Jeremiah 18:6). Duhigg points out that it is not easy to break old habits and begin new ones, but studies have shown that if we have the support of family and community there is a greater probability for change. Perhaps that is why the author of Hebrews says, "Do not neglect to meet together (in worship) as is the ethos "habit" of some." (10:25) When we gather in Jesus' name, we have the support and encouragement of one another and the promise of Jesus' presence.

My prayer for this New Year is that as individuals and as a congregation we will begin to reshape our future as disciples of Jesus Christ. Let's make a habit of worship, prayer, and Bible study so that we can all experience

the transforming power that comes through Jesus Christ. "The old has passed away; behold, the new has come." (1 Corinthians 2:17)


