Dear Friends,

Are you worried? Are you afraid? Are you troubled? Are you broken hearted?

Have you shed your tears? Have you felt that your life is in despair, and nothing can alleviate your pain?

Have you woken at night and would not be able to sleep?

Do you feel like God has ditched you?

If you do, you are not alone. The Palmist David could well resonate with you. He writes in Psalm 6, "...My soul also is greatly troubled. But you, O LORD—how long?" David unashamedly asks God that how much longer God would wait before He takes any actions. The poet is asking the same question as we are, "Does God care that we are suffering?" If so, why doesn't God respond or rescue us?

David goes on describing his anguish, "I am weary with my moaning; every night I flood my bed with tears; I drench my couch with my weeping." Can you

relate? Are you in David's shoes? This is no trivial matter. Our suffering and pain are real, we do not make them up.

We wonder why bad things would happen to us, why there are so much evil in the world, why people are hating and disserting each other, why a building would collapse and bury someone's beloved husbands, wives, children, and grandchildren. We wash our faces with our tears.

But there is hope. Although God may or may not immediately respond to us, the psalmist is confident that God will hear us. He writes with assurance, "The LORD has heard my plea; the LORD accepts my prayer."

Dear friend, in the midst of our suffering and grieving, do not lost heart. Do not doubt if God has abandoned you. He has not. Rather He has abandoned His own Son, Jesus Christ to die for us, so that we can be His children as well. If you are the children of God, hear this promise "The LORD has heard my plea; the LORD accepts my prayer." Wait for the good promise of the LORD.




Please let me know if you are willing to share your story. You can write it yourself or I can have someone interview you and write your story for you.


